



Master in Project Management

Standard Period of Studies: 18 months

ECTS Credits: 90 in total

The Master in Project Management forms two advantageous steps: firstly, the Postgraduate Certificate (PGCert), followed by the complementing Master's part. Professionals only interested in a profound, but sophisticated insight to Project Management find with the PGCert all they will need. Those being interested in the full specialisation can directly continue to complete their Master's programme in this subject area. PGCert holders can return at a later time to complete their Master's degree.

In more specific terms, the Master in Project Management is a specific pathway of Postgraduate studies preparing candidates for relevant senior management roles as project managers or in self-employment. The course's purpose is to educate the knowledgeable and responsible manager, who understands the profound challenges of project management and its wider implications, which organising, managing, and the delivery of successful projects of different kind and in a variety of industries require.
